It is important for people to understand; to understand Anangu (people of the Central Desert region of Australia), to understand Tjukurpa (our faith). To understand history. This book will be history. If it's read, maybe people will understand.

We need to write it all down. We can work together.

Otherwise there's a big wall in between us —

I can't come across and you can't come across.
